the public hearing regarding the proposal to enter into General Obligation County Purpose Loan Agreement. RESOLUTION # 9-2023 RESOLUTION TAKING ADDI-TIONAL ACTION ON PROPOS-

AL TO ENTER INTO A GENERAL **OBLIGATION COUNTY PUR-**POSE LOAN AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Clayton County, Iowa (the "County"), heretofore proposed to enter into a General Obligation County Purpose Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$8,700,000, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.441 and 331.443 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the costs. to that extent, of (a) improving and equipping emergency communica-tions systems; and (b) constructing sanitary sewer improvements and pursuant to law and duly published notice of the proposed action, has held a hearing thereon on January

24, 2023; NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Clayton County, Iowa, as follows: Section 1. The Board hereby determines to enter into the Loan Agreement in the future and or-ders that General Obligation County Purpose Bonds (the "Bonds") be issued at such time, in evidence thereof. The Board of Supervisors further declares that this resolution constitutes the "additional action" required by Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa.

Section 2. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.

Doeppke moved, Reimer seconded to approve Expected Tax-Ex-empt Obligations Report. Ayes: Doeppke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried.

Reimer moved, Doeppke seconded to approve the agreement for Piper Sandler & Co to serve as dissemination agent for secondary market disclosure. Ayes: Doeppke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried. The Board discussed the payment

schedule and timeline for bonding. Chris Jordan provided a departmental update and reviewed with the Board the FY2024 budget for Veterans Affairs and General Relief.

Peterson moved, Doeppke seconded to increase the Poverty Guidelines percentage for 2023 as 125% for General Relief and 150% for Veterans Affairs. Ayes: Doep-pke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried

Reimer moved, Doeppke second-

ed to approve a new application to coincide with submissions by residents meeting the Poverty Guidelines. Ayes: Doeppke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried.

Reimer moved, Doeppke seconded to approve a letter of support for a Child Care Market Study grant. Ayes: Doeppke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried.
