The council looked over the paper with claim scenarios to help explain what a claim might look like with a \$2,500.00 deductible compared to a \$25,000.00 deductible. After looking over the information it was moved by Wright, seconded by Landt, to change the city deducti ble from \$2,500.00 to \$5,000.00. Carried Unanimously.

5) Appliance Drop Off/Garbage Amnesty Day

It was moved Schlein, seconded by Friedley to approve Wednesday. May 14th from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. as the date and time for the annual electronic, appliance and garbage drop off day Carried Unanimously 6) Set 25/26 Budget Public Hearing Date

It was moved by Landt, seconded by Wright to set Monday, April 28, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. at the Monona City Hall Council Chamber as the date, time, and place for the 25/26 Budget Public Hearing. Carried Unanimously.

7) Crop Land Rental by Wastewater Treatment Plant

Mark Willems, with D & J Feed, said they were no longer interested in renting the land around the Wastewater Treatment plant but their former employee might be. Contacted the employee and he thought he could do it for another year. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Landt to approve the rental for one year at \$750.00 and then put it out for bid for 2026. Carried Unanimously.

8) Sales of Lawn Mower The council did not approve any bids from the January 3, 2025 deadline for the sale of the cities 2022 John Deere X350 Lawn Mower and said to put it back out for bids this spring. It was moved by Landt, seconded by Schlein to run the ads on April 16th and April 23rd with bids due by 3:00 p.m. on April

30th. Carried Unanimously. 9) Consider Raising Gateway Park Campground Fee

After reviewing the rental information from 2024 it was moved by Wright, seconded by Schlein to approve raising the daily camping rate of \$25.00 per night to \$35.00 effective 2025. Carried Unanimously. 10) Discuss Next Step for 115 W. Center St.

The city recently obtained ownership of the property located at 115 W. Center St. The owner of the property to the east of the building, Michael Schultz, was at the meeting. He stated that he had a legal contract to purchase the building from the previous owner that was never finalized. He was still interested in purchasing this building from the city. After much discussion on plans for the building it was moved by Wright, seconded by Landt to obtain some more information on either keeping or demolishing the building and to set up a date for a walk through. Carried Unanimously.

11) City Accounting Program After some discussion about the city's accounting program, Gworks moving to the cloud, the cost of changing programs, and the timeframe and pros and cons of staying with Gworks, it was moved by Wright, seconded by Landt, to approve allowing the administrative staff in research programs and decide what they feel would work best for the city in the long term.
