Chief Wille would like the council to approve the hiring of Drake Tilson as a reserve officer. It was moved by Wright, seconded by Schlein, to approve Drake Tilson as a reserve officer. Carried Unanimously. 4) MCED – Monona Mural Ryan Johnson, President of the Monona Chamber and Economic Development Group presented the council with a mural proposal and a request for the city to pay for one-third of the mural. After much discussion, it was moved Elledge, seconded by Landt to approve onethird of the cost of the mural not to exceed \$3,000.00. Carried Unanimously. 5) Clayton County Marketing Cam-

marketing campaign. It was moved by Landt, seconded by Schlein to approve the same \$1,000.00 donation as in 2025. Carried Unanimously.

6) Approve Fiscal Agent Agreement

After looking over the fiscal agent agreement, prepared by the city attorney, for the Monona Scout Provisional Troop 138, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Wright, to approve the agreement. Carried Unanimously. 7) Consider Bids for City Lawn

Mower

City Administrator Collins talked to the council about the bids received from the second rounds of ads for the X350 mower. They city received two bids with the highest being \$2,2450.00. The Public Works Director, Adam Jones, talked to the council about trading in the X350 on a new 2025 ZR 955. The trade in amount would be \$3,600.00. Since the ad's suggested price was \$3,700.00 and since the ad stated the city had the right to reject and all bids the council rejected. It was moved by Landt, seconded by Wright, to approve trading in the X350 on a 2024 SR 955 for \$15,000.00. Carried Unanimously. 8) Sewer Extension on Spruce Street

Chris Hankes, Hankes Garage Doors, purchased some property within the City of Monona and would like to get water and sewer to the property. After some discussion about where water and sewer lines are currently, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Friedley to work with him to get water and sewer lines to his building. Carried unanimously. 9) Resolution 2025-07 Authorizing

and Approving an Amended and Restated Land and Disbursement Agreement and Amended and Restated Sewer Revenue Bond

Due to the city receiving a forgivable amount of \$149,241 of a \$212,000 SRF Loan, the city needed to amend and approve new paperwork. It was moved by Landt, seconded by Wright to approve Resolution 2025-07. ROLL CALL: Five ayes, Nayes none, Motion Carried.

10 City Billboards

The council was presented with two designs for the two billboards located on the East and West side of HWY 18. The Lamar advertising team created them. After some discussion, the council asked that Lamar address the fonts, cursive lettering, continuity of the overall design, add all the top words into the banner, exchange the yellow flower with another butterfly or a different flower and add camping to the bottom words. Administrator Collins will send updates to the council as soon as she receives them.

11) Community Center Rates The community center is nearly 27 years old and the fees have not been raised in 21 years. After some discussion about things that need updating/fixing, it was moved by Elledge, seconded by Wright to ap-prove the rate changes as follows: 1 to 50 people = \$50, 51 to 100 people = \$100, and over 100 people = \$400.
