Due to the small number of lifeguard applications and having the new pool manager quit shortly before pool opening it was decided to review our wages and compare them to other local pools. It was then decided to raise the manager, assistant manager, lifeguard wages and set the WSI wage as \$0.50 over the guard's current wage. It was moved by Meyer and seconded by Schlein to approve Resolution 2022-15 setting new wages for the Family Aquatic Center. Roll Call: Ayes - Five, Nays - None Motion

4) 2022/2023 Fiscal Year Wages Administrators Collins presented the council with a memo showing the current wages of public works, administration, and police wages. The memo also showed what their wages would be with a \$.50 raise. 3%, 4% and 5% wage increase. After much discussion it was moved by Wright, seconded by Meyer to approve a \$1.00 wage increase for public works, police and administration. Aves - Four. Landt abstained from voting. Motion Carried.

5) Trees for Gateway Park and City Park

Due to request of Public Works Director, Randy Evanson, and not getting awarded a tree grant, the council approved \$2,550.00 to be used to purchase some new trees for City Park and Gateway Park at the May 2nd meeting. The council also asked for a map showing where we currently have trees at the two parks. City Administrator Collins presented the council with maps showing the current placement of trees at the parks and a list of available trees at Outdoor Creations in Monona. After some discussion about the available trees and where they should be planted it was moved by Meyer, seconded by Wright to approve the purchase of four Quaking Aspen to be planted by the three pull-through camp sites at Gateway Park and two New Harmony Elm, one American Sentry Linden, and one Whitespire Birch to be planted in the central area of City

Park. Carried Unanimously. 6) Old Outdoor Warning Siren Paul Kurk, with ComElec, asked if the city would be interested in selling one of our old outdoor sirens The city of Cobb, WI, population 418, lost their only siren due to a lightning strike. The city replaced our three old sirens with two new sirens in 2019/2020. We were able to drop to two sirens since the new sirens rotate. After applying our grant funds, the new sirens cost the city \$5,545.33. Paul was not sure if Cobb would be interested in the one in storage, working at the time it was taken down or the siren and pole in City Park. Not 100% sure if the siren in the park is currently operational. After some discussion about it was moved by Meyer, seconded by Elledge to offer Cobb the siren in storage for \$2,500.00. The council thought they would like to keep the park siren since it is already in place in the case something happens to one of our other sirens. Carried Unanimously.
