Motion by Aaron Schroeder, seconded by Tonya Meyer, to add Aaron Schroeder to the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

The agenda was approved as presented with the addition of Aaron Schroeder. Motion made by Tonya Meyer, seconded by Josh Grau. Motion carried unanimously.

The Secretary's Report, Activity Report and Food Service Report will be filed subject to audit. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Tonya Meyer, seconded by Dr. Moser, to approve the following contracts and resignations: Resignations: Sherri Kerr – Title, Angie Pape – Freshman Volleyball, Paul Rasmussen – 7th Grade Volleyball

New Contracts: Sherry Cotton – Elementary Paraprofessional, Transfer: Angela Rumph from JV Volley to 7th Grade Volleyball. Motion carried unanimously. Nine FFA members spoke to the board about their recent trip to Indi-

anapolis for the FFA National Convention. They made a stop in Peoria, Illinois, to tour the Caterpillar factory, they participated in leadership workshops, escaped an Escape Room, learned about Ozark Fisheries, and made new friends.

Discussion regarding Board Policies 210 Development of Policy and 210.1 Revision of Policy. Superintendent Dugger asked the Board for input on how they would like policy changes/revisions to be implemented in the future. It was decided that the Board will have two readings, over a two-month period and all changes will be highlighted.

Motion by Dr. Moser, seconded by Tonya Meyer, to accept the make-up calendar as presented. The first two snow/weather days will not need to be made up. The State is allowing districts to use up to five days of virtual learning in these cases. Mr. Dugger will manage those days/hours. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Dugger presented the Board with District Student and Financial Data. Enrollment has increased again, and the fund balances are currently in good shape. This could change with a future decrease in enrollment and the end of Esser funding.

Motion by Aaron Schroeder, seconded by Roberta Hass, to request to the School Budget Review Committee in the amount of \$43,007.00 for increased enrollment during the fall of 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Josh Grau, seconded by Tonya Meyer, to request to the School Budget Review Committee in the amount of \$3,613.50 for modified supplemental amount due to uncounted open enrollments during the Fall of 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Tonya Meyer, seconded by Dr. Moser, to move the December Organizational meeting from December 18 to December 11, 2023, to meet reporting requirements. Motion carried unanimously.

Aaron Schroeder spoke about the need of the Board and Administration to work together transparently to ensure that all Board members

have a say in policy changes and general district business/practices. REPORTS:

Student Board Members reported the following activities in the high school: Holiday Carnival, Little Mermaid musical, mock interviews, Karlie Hagensick went to All State, FFA meals, Veteran's Day program, State Runner-up in Football, UIC Honor Band and Chorus, Group Speech, SODA activities and the start of basketball and wrestling seasons.

Larry Meyer, High School Principal, added that conferences were held, SIAC committee met, and safety meetings continue to be held.

Denise Mueller, Middle School Principal, reports the following: fall concert, conferences, the McGregor Center travelled to Monona to watch the musical, Opus, Character Ed Days, Red Ribbon Run, Pep Rally, and the beginning of winter sports.

Abbey Cottrell, Assistant Elementary Principal, reported that only six families missed conferences, the preschool audit is underway, Book Fair was successful, Red Ribbon Week, Wetland Center activities have wrapped up and the elementary enjoyed The Little Mermaid.

Tim Dugger, Superintendent, and Erik Peterson talked about changes to the existing stage in the Monona center. The board gave their approval to begin the process of removing curtains and unused electrical/heating units. In the future, four feet of the stage may be removed to make room for a scorer's table and the basketball teams. This would open up seats on the east side of the gym and would stop spectators from walking in front of the teams, coaches and scorekeepers. Live streams are now done through HUDL on YouTube. Fans can now watch games without a fee.

The next meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. on December 11, 2023, in the Monona Schoolhouse Learning Commons.

November 7, 2023

Meeting of the Clayton County Board of Supervisors at 600 Gunder Road NE, Elkader, Iowa.

Present: Steve Doepcke, Ray Peterson and Doug Reimer. Guests: Chris Jordan, Jenna Pollock, Casey Stickfort and Mike Tschirgi

Chris Jordan gave the Board an update on Veteran's Affairs programming and the review of Clayton County's human resources processes.

Doepcke moved, Reimer seconded to approve the meeting minutes from the October 30, 2023. Ayes: Doepcke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried.

Reimer moved, Doepcke seconded to approve the claims as presented totaling \$295,634.44. Ayes: Doepcke, Peterson, Reimer. Motion carried.

Reimer moved to approve Resolution #47-2023: Resolution in Support of an Application from The Clayton County Conservation Board for an Enhance Iowa/Community Attraction and Tourism Grant for Pony Hollow Trail Extension. Doepcke seconded. Roll Call Vote: Doepcke-aye, Peterson-aye, Reimer-aye. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, the State of Iowa has funds through the Enhance Iowa program, specifically the Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) grant, designated to support projects that provide recreational, cultural, entertainment and educational attractions; and

WHEREAS, the Clayton County Conservation Board (CCCC) promotes the health and general welfare of the people and encourages recreation through responsible use and appreciation of natural resources through land trail development; and

WHEREAS, the CCCC is currently working to extend Pony Hollow trail one mile near Elkader; and

WHEREAS, this project fits the criteria for a CAT grant and the CCCC intends to apply for those funds; and

WHEREAS, guidelines for the CAT grant indicate applications shall demonstrate local support;

and WHEREAS, the Clayton County Supervisors heard a presentation about this project at their meeting on October 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the County believes the Pony Hollow Trail Extension will add both economic and quality of life benefits for residents and visitors alike; and

WHEREAS, the County also believes this project helps the Clayton County Conservation Board take steps to complete their long range transportation plan to fuse community trail connections through the larger Regional Backbone Trail project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1) The County supports the application of the Clayton County Conservation Board for Enhance Iowa funds through the CAT grant program for the Pony Hollow Trail Extension;

2) The County pledges \$200,000 towards this project.

No bids were received for the rural services shed that had been advertised. The bid period will be extended for two weeks.

WHEREAS, a county may apply for modifications to its farm to market system to add or subtract mileage from its system, to accept or delete highways gained or lost through jurisdictional transfers, or to change the classification of

roads within its system, and WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Clayton County has consulted with its County Engineer and desires to modify its farm to market road system to provide continuity of intra-county and inter-county routes, to meet the needs of existing or potential traffic, to better meet land use needs, or to provide a more suitable location for a farm to market route, and

WHEREAS, application for modifications to any county's farm to market system must be made to the Farm to Market Review Board per the requirements of Code of Iowa Section 306.6,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CLAYTON COUNTY that this county is formally requesting that the Farm to Market Review Board approve the following modifications to its farm to market system:

Road segments proposed for addition to the farm to market system: SE High Street from Elkader Corporation limits to Highway 13

Total Mileage added to the Farm to Market System: .19 miles

Road segments within city corporate limits as farm to market extensions: SE High Street from E. Bridge Street to Elkader Corporation limits

Total Mileage added to Farm to Market Extension System: .60 miles

Road segments proposed for deletion from the farm to market system: Total Mileage deleted from the Farm to Market System: .0 miles

Road segments proposed for deletion from the farm to market extension system: Bridge Street from Highway 56 to Highway 13

Total Mileage deleted from the farm to market extension system: .64 miles
